## Club Mallets – "Out with the old in with the new"

More good news for club members with an opportunity to replace 4 or 5 old club mallets with a variety of modern mallets constructed from various materials varying in length and weight.

This week the Club was invited by the Federal Member for Bradfield, the Hon Paul Fletcher MP to apply for a grant under the "Stronger Communities Programme".

Nominated project title : Club Coaching Mallets for Croquet.

Total project expenditure : \$2,800 Grant amount nominated : \$2,500 Equity: Club pre-approved : \$ 300 Being invited to apply is the first step in the grant process and does not guarantee we will be successful. We are required to complete a formal application for assessment by an independent Government body for eligibility and recommendation for approval to the Department of Industry, Science and Resources with final allocation of funds undertaken by the Federal member for Bradfield.

## WCC Committee - News and procedural changes:

### GC to be played on a Monday morning:

With the ever-increasing number of new members wanting to participate in Golf Croquet the WCC Committee have approved the allocation of the Monday morning session 10-00am to 12-30pm to the playing of Golf Croquet. The members' on-line booking system will be amended within the week.

#### **Croquet Lawn maintenance times**

With the increase in participation numbers along with the ability to play 7days a week, restricts the times available to undertake the necessary lawn maintenance. To resolve the issue and to avoid any unnecessary inconvenience to members, our greenkeepers will be given access to the booking system so that they can book the free time needed to spray and maintain the lawn.

Under normal circumstances mowing the lawn can take an hour. Marking the lawn for competitions and general play can be undertaken within the hour. Spraying, however, may require a session as spraying can only take place when there is no rain pending. No wind as the club has a responsibility of care to the Child Care Center and when no members are about, again the club has a responsibility to its members and guests.

For obvious reasons lawn maintenance, repair and servicing is essential and takes priority over croquet bookings. It's a bit like the chicken and the egg as to who comes first. However, providing Darren, James and Glen with access to the booking system ensures us every endeavor will be made to provide members with adequate notice to avoid any inconvenience and to accommodate their playing needs.

#### Change to the payment method for game fees.

For reasons of accountability, security and insurance The Club is seeks to introduce an alternative to the current practice of paying WCC game fees and the keeping of an unlocked cash box in the WCC office.

Commencing immediately payment of game fees (\$8.00) is to be made at the bar using cash or cards. For convenience payments in advance can be made to cover multiple games, a separate receipt will be issued for each \$8- payment. Members are to place receipts in the existing tin in the WCC office and to continue to initial the players attendance sheet.

For days when the club is closed (Sundays and Public holidays) game fees will be on an honor system with payment made by those members during their next visit to the club. Naturally the tea/coffee coin jar will remain and continue.
